GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE CO-OPERATIVE

The Central Coast Woodturners Co-op is a not-for-profit Co-operative with the club being formed in 1985 by a small group of enthusiasts, to promote the art of wood turning and related skills. We conduct monthly meetings where members and guests share information, display projects, hear guest speakers and see demonstrations. We have groups involved in woodturning, scroll sawing, carving, toy making and pyrography.

MEMBERSHIP

Currently there is a \$10 joining fee and an annual subscription of \$45 (due on 30th June each year). Members must be at least 18 years old.

A \$50 fee will be charged for new members wishing to learn woodturning. This is to cover the cost of timber and other materials used during their training. A \$20 fee for beginner carving material.

GENERAL MEETINGS

Our monthly meeting is held on the first Saturday of each month at Allison Homestead Museum from 10am. The meetings involve sharing of relevant information, general club business and Show and Tell.

CLUBHOUSE / WORKSHOP

Currently closed but searching for new premises. The workshop will allow for training and use involving woodturning, scroll sawing, carving, toy making and pyrography. Training is offered to 15 year-olds provided they are accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult. Merchandise is also available for purchase (members only)..

SOCIAL PROMOTIONAL EVENTS

These include liaison and visits with other clubs, demonstrations, displays, sales at shopping centres and other events.
