PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Just when you thought you would not be hearing from me again as President, here I am again, but with some good news that I wanted to share with you before 'riding off into the sunset'. All will be explained below.

Firstly, I am glad to say the board accepted my resignation, not that I had given them much choice. However, at the next Club meeting, a week later, Terry Jones put up his hand to take over. This was very good news for me and very good news for the Club. This nomination has to be approved by the board. As I was 'acting' President the board can agree to Terry's appointment, but, like all



positions in the club, Terry will need to stand for the position at the next AGM, something he intends to do. This is good news as CCWT needs some stability at this time as our future is still not secure. We only have three and a half years left on this lease.

The second piece of good news is the opening of our Wednesday evening workshop. This was something I had long proposed and to see it happen just before I retire as president was especially satisfying. Richard W and Bernie C are the leaders at this evening workshop, though while Bernie is away Ron is standing in. This is great as right from the first night we have at least five beginners, four of whom are new members.



Remember, this is not just for beginners, existing members are welcome to come along. Just remember you might be asked to give up your lathe if more beginners come along. This means the workshop is open six days of the week. As I drove to the workshop on Monday, I was considering how to phrase my disappointment at the falling numbers attending the workshop. However, on arriving I could not park, nor find a lathe, should I have wanted one. Let's hope this Thursday and Friday are the same.

We are also open on Thursday afternoon for experienced turners. This to give instructors and board members time to do their own tuning. I say experienced turners only, as instructors will be on the lathes for their own projects. That is not to say they won't mind giving the odd piece of advice, but remember they are there to do their own thing.

There are some developments in relation to sales. We enjoyed some level of success at the Gosford Show, organised on our behalf by Valda. It proved the saying that if the right

person turns up on the right day, price is not the concern. I managed to sell a \$250 bowl because the right person showed up. Whilst we thank Valda for all the work she put into this year's sale, and whilst the board has agreed to participate in the Gosford show next year, we were unable to guarantee the requirements needed next year, so we are looking for someone else to organise our participation in 2026.

This long weekend we will be showing at the Jilliby School on Saturday and Sunday 7th & 8th June.

Still on sales Don has done a lot of work on producing a spreadsheet to help streamlining the finance side of sales. As Don has not been well recently, now that he is well on the road to recovery we look forward to putting this into use. It is hoped the spreadsheet will reduce the paper work on the day, as well as making calculations of donation to the club and calculating their own return.



Facilities at the club workshop are developing. The second container now has shelving ready for wood sales to members. All sales at the club will be going into the club operating account with a percentage donated to the toy fund. There is a large quantity of wood donated to the club and stock piled by the containers and at Alan Smith's property. As soon as the ground is dry enough, we intend to organise some working bees to cut and store this wood. At the moment we are not accepting any more timber, unless it is a special species. Every so often we get offered wood from a deceased estate. We woodturners like to build up our own supply. This wood is usually dry and in reasonable sized blocks. Again, we have a supply of wood at the workshop.

So, members after six years and three months, this is my last report. Thank you for your support during that time and, if I have forgotten anything, it explains why it is time for new hands at the helm.


Don Crittenden, who looked after the recording of sales, and Peter Hamilton who lent his valuable assistance and knowledge.

From "The Shop"

At Central Coast Wood Turners we do not have a comprehensive range of goods, but certainly, we have a lot of the basics.

FINISHING:

We have sand papers from 120grit up to 600grit.

There are various hook and loop sandpapers of varying grits.

For surface finishes we have U Beaut EEE Ultra Shine and U Beaut Shellawax.

KITS:

There are a variety of different pen kits. We also have a few bushing sets for different style pens.

There are some cheese knife kits and similar for those who might want to make some kitchen items.

There are a few clock mechanisms, as well as many hands and number styles.

Lazy Susans of different sizes are available.

For those wanting to try pen turning with acrylic, we also have some blanks available.

GLUES:

There are two types:

Skeeta purchased a large container of TiteBond and some of this has been decanted and is for sale.

Superglue is often used for unstable timber or when there may be slight cracks. We did have some but it tends to evaporate, harden or go off over time so none is available at the moment.

If you need some superglue then consider getting some from a 'cheap shop'. Places such as TimberBits sell CA glue (varying viscosities) as well as accelerators so if Super Glue is needed maybe think of getting it online.

Unfortunately, we cannot stock all items but focus on those that will help you until the final stage of your project.



Should you have an idea about items that we could stock and that would last over time, please see me or one of the Board members so that it can be considered.

I hope this gives an idea about some of the shop items for sale and maybe ideas for projects.



Membership fees are about to fall due. Our membership year runs from July 1st to June 30th.


If you only joined in the last few months then we don't expect you to pay again.


