They are sympathetic to our cause and are extremely supportive. Meanwhile, a meeting has been arranged with officers from Council with respect to resurrecting discussions about getting a section of Alison Homestead. 




A new blade was put in the Band Saw after only 1 week, please don't cut circles using this saw, instead cut straight cuts slowly taking off the corners.
