#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

For the first time as President, I am trying to match Alan's deadline for the Hobby Turner. Unfortunately, I was away on Rotary business at the time of the last Club meeting. The fall-out from that Rotary meeting must act as a warning to us all that the threat posed by Covid-19 has not passed. In Melbourne some 15,000 or more delegates from all over the world gathered for the annual International Convention. The conference part of the Convention was held at the Rod Laver Arena, where all the delegates met on four consecutive mornings. When less attendees were expected large portions of the



auditorium were closed off. Delegates were crowded into less space so the hall would appear full. On the way home from the Convention my wife tested positive for Covid-19. During the week that followed, while she developed a cough, I felt increasingly unwell, until I also tested positive. Two other members of my Rotary Club, who also attended the Convention, have tested positive. I have since discovered that at least six others from the Central Coast have tested positive as a direct result of attending that Convention in Melbourne. I relate this story at length to highlight the continuing threat of the pandemic and a need to continue to be cautious.

Well done the four members who brought items to the 'show and tell' at the June meeting. Congratulations to Ron Gibbs for his Mantra Ray Box made from Jacaranda. I have seen Ron's Mantra Ray work before and watched him turning such an item on the lathe. The





I personally always find the critique of items gives me useful advice and ideas for my own woodturning.

Until the Alison Homestead agrees its lease with Central Coast Council, we can make little progress there. If we are to increase the number of people attending each month, we must make the meetings worth attending. This will also help to retain membership which has declined a little over the pandemic time.

So far Alan has done brilliantly but photographs and articles to be included would help Alan a great deal. 
# I'm so glad I was taught to play the recorder at school



The meeting closed at 11:10 am




