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#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT~ JULY 2020:

In the past few months we have experienced an unprecedented upheaval to our wellbeing, both health wise, family and socially. Our 'normal' way of life has been closed down and it is only now we are beginning to return to the things we had before.

Based on the change in restrictions, but still following guidelines, the Board decided we are able to open the workshop again, but in a very restricted way. Having drawn up a Covid-19 Safety Plan, set an opening date for August 3<sup>rd</sup>, along came the problems in Victoria. The resurgence of the virus must serve as a reminder that this problem is not over yet and we must still exercise extreme caution.



The Covid-19Safety Plan and covering letter gave details of opening, which has been sent electronically to all members outlining details on what the Club is doing in order to get some activity back to CCWC. It is down to members to follow the rules and behave responsibly if we are to stay open. I was going to say that we would be able to increase numbers allowed into the workshop as the restrictions are eased, but that was before the recent resurgence of the virus in Victoria. We must remember that a great many of our members are in the 'most at risk' bracket. This is why we need to be so cautious. If you are in any doubt as to your health please do not attend the workshop. Some members might still be feeling worried about coming to the workshop. This is quite understandable and a sensible precaution.

When the workshop opens we will only have five lathes in use. This is to preserve the social distance of 1.5m. Even if the 4m rules are reduced we are still governed by social distance. We will also only be able to have one workshop manager. Likewise the carving room only has space for two people but this number would be able to increase slightly should the 4m rule alter. There is only enough space in the shop for one person serving and one customer outside the shop. Other customers will have to wait outside. There will also be a workshop manager for the shop. I have been told there is enough stock in the shop but it might be wise to check beforehand that the shop has what you want. More details on that will follow.

It is most important that you do not come to the workshop unless you are on one of the rotas or you need supplies from the shop. You must not just turn up hoping to get a lathe or meet people for a chat. Just staying outside the workshop in the car park is not enough. You would still be counted as being part of the workshop and expected to keep social distance. The workshop manager might well ask you to leave, or at least go to a different part of the Milk Factory.

The tea-room will be closed. It will only be open as access to the shop and carving room. The regime of cleaning and disinfecting after each use is beyond us at this stage. People using the workshop are asked to bring their own morning tea or use the café. Chairs will not be available again because of cleaning and disinfecting rules.

Our first Club meeting is planned for September 1<sup>st</sup>. This has still to be agreed with the Milk Factory. This will be the A.G.M. Again we will send more details on this nearer the date.

I realise this all sounds very restrictive but hopefully everything is in the best interests of our members. Some members have commented on the apparent lack of social distancing in community

areas such as cafes. That is no reason for us to be complacent about our approach to cleanliness and hygiene.

Details of attendance rotas will be sent to you shortly. Because of the 1.5m distance rule we are unable to offer tuition at this stage. There will be no new members needing tuition when we first open. The new Board will review this decision when the meet in September. There are a few potential new members who will just need an assessment of their skills. The workshop manager can do this. If you have a lathe at home perhaps consider whether it is necessary for you to use a lathe at the workshop. This would more people without equipment at home the opportunity to turn.

Hopefully, as a nation, we have turned the corner on tis pandemic. Despite the nay-sayers and conspiracy believers I feel it is very important that we look out for each other and do all we can to protect all our members.

I will allocate names to a spread sheet under the chosen session. The first five names will be offered a lathe, then the next five and the next five and so on until everybody opting for that session has had an opportunity. We then go back to the top and repeat the five etc. You may only be on the list for one session.

You may only choose one option though I will contact people if a particular session is over populated.

#### **CARVERS**

The situation is slightly more complicated for the carver's room. The number of people allowed is based on both 4m and 1.5m rules. The calculation under the 4m rule is complex. The number  $\frac{2}{2}$  has been well researched but could well increase if this restriction is eased.

The same kind or rota will also apply to the carvers.

#### WORKSHOP MANAGER

It is essential that all members co-operate with the workshop manager at all times. Workshop managers will be members of the board and allocated a session before opening on August 3<sup>rd</sup>.

It is the responsibility of the workshop manager to ensure strict adherence to government restrictions. He/she will also ensure that all equipment is correctly cleaned and disinfected after each session.

#### PLEASE CONTACT PETER HAMILTON AND STATE YOU PREFERRED SESSION

As there is much less demand for the carver's room I suspect it will be easier to allocate people and they will get more opportunity than for the lathes.

#### TEA ROOM

The tea room will be closed for August and September. This is because we will be unable to ensure that numbers do not exceed the  $4m^2$  rule and members keeping 1.5m distance.

The tea room will only be open for access to the carver's room.

Please bring your own morning tea or use the café.

Please do not attend the club unless you are one of the people allocated on the rota or you wish to come to the shop. All members must report to the workshop manager on arrival. They will need to sign in giving the contact information required.



#### President's Report: Peter Hamilton presented his report for the year 2018/2019.




