- + **NOTES FROM THE EQUIPMENT OFFICER:**
 - This month has seen continual improvements happening in the workshop and general reorganization of various tools to improve housekeeping.
 - I would like to remind all members please to return any tools to the appropriate holders and cupboards after use. We are still having to put chisels away on a weekly basis after club days.
 - Various projects and tasks underway at present include:
 - o Quotation to purchase and install a new AC motor and inverter controller for the recently failed Woodfast lathe motor.
 - o Continued installation of the video recording system with proper camera mounts. Next will see the wiring improved and computer control cabinet to assist recording demonstrations
 - o Continued with making more curved tool rests from steel bars
 - o Plans to build a proper rack holder for the variety of tool rests. This will mount on the wall behind the pedestal drill.
 - o Drawing plans for a new outdoor cage to house the large sections of wood we have. All designed to improve tidying up the workshop



- We received a donation of an old 1940s lathe in old rusty condition. I am now stripping it back, repainting it and will build a simple steel frame to mount it against the front wall of the clubhouse as a static display.
 - We also have met a chap (Dan) who works for a local tree removal company that will regularly drop off to us logs and other pieces of wood that we can use.
 - New equipment has been donated to the club from the local high school including a large band saw, pedestal drill and saw bench. These have been gratefully received and included in the workshop
 - Kerry has been busy making new wheeled frames under the large band saw for easy maneuvering.
- At the last meeting we discussed the project to upgrade the broken Woodfast lathe.
 - I have now obtained a quote from Gosford Motor Rewinds for the equipment.
 - If the board agrees can I get a cheque payable for the amount shown of \$801.68 to them so we can purchase the necessary items. I can simply buy the other hardware parts and put it all together .

Motion: Pay for repairs to the Woodfast Lathe. Passed.

- ✚ Graham S can also pick up items and drop off money at the clubhouse.



- 3)A "heap" of give-away "Cow Ornaments" ready for the next Open Day.


The thought is that since we meet at the Wyong Old Milk Factory a "cow" is more appropriate than a "hug"... Good idea Clarry.

The woman turns the can around so that the man can read the label.



Jeanne Louise Calment had the longest confirmed human lifespan on record: 122 years and 164 days.

It seems that fate strongly approved of the way Madam Calment lived her life.

Jeanne was born in Arles, France, on 21st February 1875.

When the Eiffel Tower was built, she was 14 year old.

It was at this time that she met Vincent van Gogh.

"He was dirty, badly dressed and disagreeable," she recalled in an interview given in 1988.

When she was 85, she took up fencing, and she was still riding on her bike when she reached 100.

When Jeanne was 114, she starred in a film about her life; at 115 she had an operation on her hip, and at 117 she gave up

smoking (having started at the age of 21 in 1896).

Apparently, she didn't give it up for health reasons, but because she didn't like having to ask someone to help her light a cigarette once she was becoming almost blind.

In 1965, Jeanne was 90 years old and had no heirs.

She signed a deal to sell her apartment to a 47-year-old lawyer called André-François Raffray.

He agreed to pay her a monthly sum of 2,500 francs on the condition that he would inherit her apartment after she died.

However, Raffray not only ended up paying Jeanne for 30 years, but died before she did at the age of 77.

His widow was legally obliged to continue paying Madam Calment until the end of her days.

Jeanne retained sharp mental faculties.

When she was asked on her 120th birthday what kind of future she expected to have, she replied: "A very short one."

Quotes and rules of life from Jeanne Calment:

"Being young is a state of mind, it doesn't depend on one's body, I'm actually still a young girl; it's just that I haven't looked so good for the past 70 years."

"All babies are beautiful."

"I've been forgotten by our good lord."

"I'm in love with wine."

"Always keep your smile. That's how I explain my long life."

"If you can't change something, don't worry about it."

"I have a huge desire to live and a big appetite, especially for sweets."

"I never wear mascara; I laugh until I cry too often."

"I see badly, I hear badly, and I feel bad, but everything's fine."

"I think I will die of laughter."

"I have legs of iron, but to tell you the truth, they're starting to rust and buckle a bit."

"I took pleasure when I could. I acted clearly and morally and without regret. I'm very lucky."

(At the end of one interview, in response to a journalist who said he hoped they would meet again the following year):

"Why not? You're not that old; you'll still be here."
