
Ron Gibbs was awarded a \$10 voucher for his entry in Kevin's challenge.

Minutes: The minutes of the previous AGM minutes were published in the August edition of the Hobby Turner.

It was moved by Ray Grennan and seconded by Frank Barton that the minutes as published in the August hobby Turner be accepted. Passed.

President's Report: Peter Hamilton presented his report for the year 2018/2019.

The Club has had a very successful year following Ron's previous outstanding tenure when much of the Club's major items of equipment were upgraded. There has been a steady stream of new members, although, sadly, some long time members have been lost to the Club. The large number of people who make significant contributions to the Club were acknowledged. The vital contribution made to the Club by the trainers was especially acknowledged. Hi Folks,

As you are probably aware, we are hosting the Central Coast Craft Extravaganza in the grounds of the Wyong Milk Factory on 16th and 17th of November. We will be demonstrating and selling all our crafts at this event (all commission from the sales will go to the Central Coast Outreach Centre... one of our favoured charities). Commission for the event, as we don't have to pay additional rent, will be 10% of all items sold

During normal sales it is expected that those that are selling items will be there to assist at the tables, for this event we are only asking that they be available for some time over the weekend, so the more we have selling the less time you will be expected to attend.

We expect to fill the tea room, cavers/scroll saw room and a number of marquees up towards the coffee shop with items to sell and it will not be one table per person or craft, we will mix all and any item that our members wish to put out for sale for the weekend, what gets sold will be backfilled with something else.

We do not care if you have 2 or 222 items that you want to put into the sale your product will be welcome. Note that as we still want to keep the level high, as the event is as much for talking about our craft and selling the items, we have 4 people selected that will judge if the item is of a standard to be put on the table. Saying all this I would expect any of our members to submit below standard items anyway. THIS MESSAGE IS BEING SENT TO THOSE NEWER MEMBERS IN PARTICULAR THAT MAY HAVE JUST A FEW ITEMS THAT THAT WANT TO TRY AT A MARKET, NOT JUST TO THOSE THAT USUALLY SELL.










I Thought The Dryer Made My Clothes Shrink. Turns Out It Was The Refrigerator. You drop something when you were younger, you just pick it up.
